

# Choosing Courses in Grade 9 and 10...

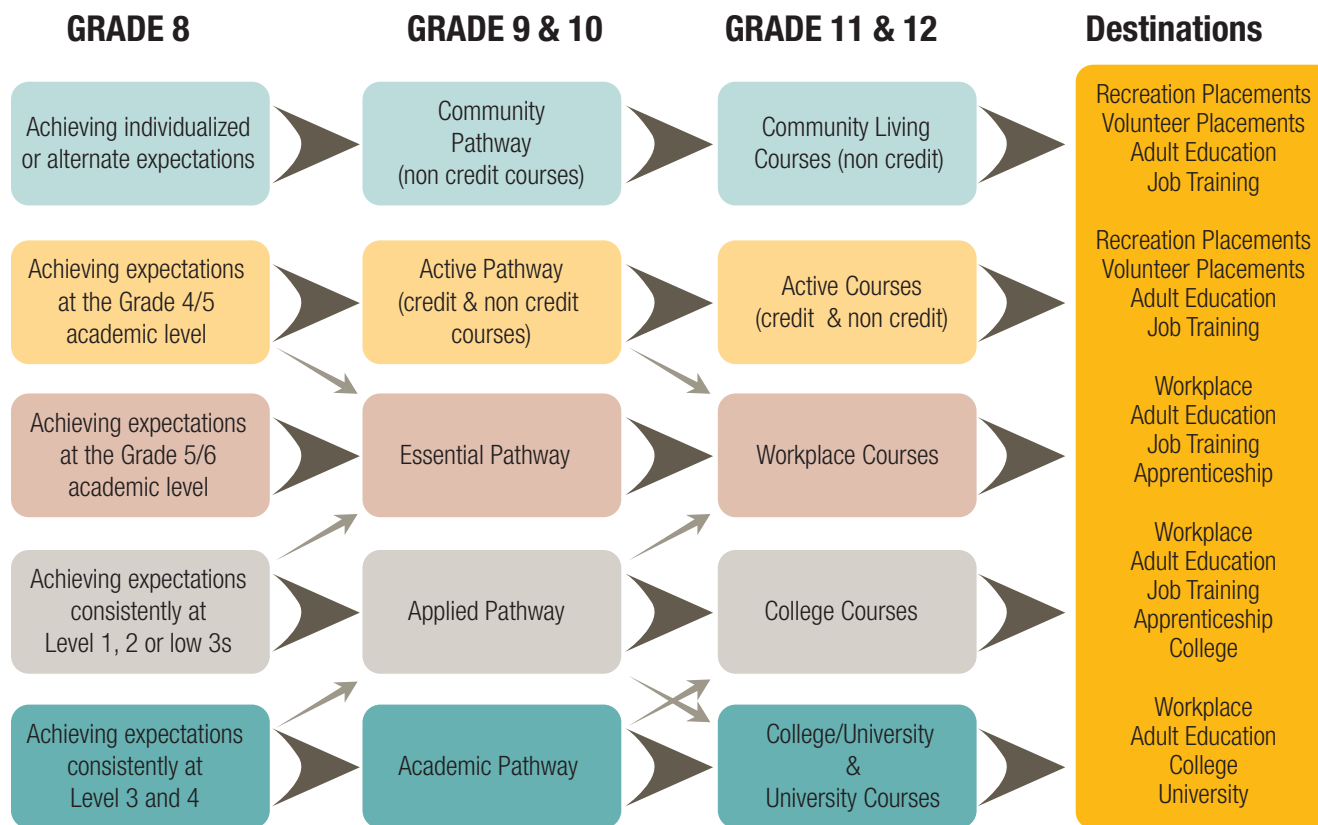
All grade 9 courses build on the elementary curriculum and prepare students for studies in grades 10, 11 and 12. In core areas such as English, Mathematics, History and Science, students will choose to study these compulsory subjects in either the Applied, Academic or Essential streams.

In subjects such as Religion, Health and Physical Education, the Arts, Technological Education and Business, all students will take an open course.

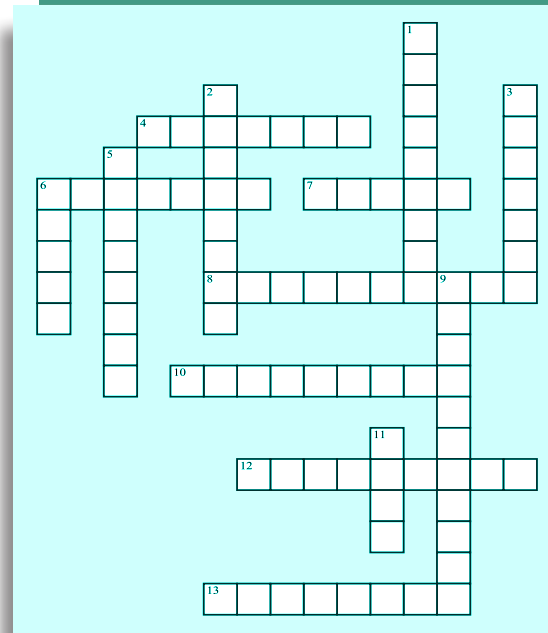
ACTIVE and Community Living courses are non-credit courses designed for students working on differentiated expectations as outlined on their Individual Education Plan (IEP). Placement in the ACTIVE or Community Living Program is done in consultation with Elementary Staff and Secondary Special Education Staff.
