Special Message For Grade 7 & 8 Students



...DID YOU KNOW...

There are 7,866 students attending Waterloo Region’s five Catholic Secondary Schools – served by 700 dedicated staff members (including 524 teachers)!



*In the 1970’s – before full-funding of Catholic high schools was granted in Ontario – St. Jerome’s & St. Mary’s parents and students raised money in almost every way imaginable via the “**Make it Happen**” campaign. Today, the **Waterloo Region Catholic Schools Foundation** helps “bridge the gap”.*

Where It All Began...

St. Jerome’s High School – for 125 years the flagship Catholic school in Waterloo Region – was established in a one-room log cabin near St. Agatha in 1865. **St. Mary’s High School** opened on Weber St. in Kitchener in 1929. Between them, the two schools graduated 10’s of thousands of students.

St. Jerome’s closed in 1990 (replaced by **Resurrection C.S.S.**) and **St. Mary’s** moved to its new location in 2002. The former St. Mary’s buildings now comprise the Waterloo Region Catholic Education Centre / Kitchener Downtown Community Centre, while portions of the old St. Jerome’s house the Board’s St. Louis Adult Learning & Continuing Education Centre.

St. Benedict was opened in Cambridge in 1962 as a “Junior High School” and was joined by **Monsignor Doyle** Junior High in the 1970’s. Waterloo received its own Junior High in 1965 with the opening of **St. David’s**.

All of them are now, of course, full service secondary schools – offering a learning environment and range of programs the Reverend Fathers of the **Congregation of the Resurrection** and the **School Sisters of Notre Dame** couldn’t possibly have imagined in the early days of St. Jerome’s & St. Mary’s.
