Background/Comments:

Special Education Plan

In accordance with Regulation 306, Waterloo Catholic District School Board (WCDSB) is required, every two years, to prepare and approve a report on the special education programs and special education services provided by WCDSB, and to submit it to the ministry. Each board is required to maintain a special education plan, to review it annually, to amend it from time to time to meet the current needs of students with special needs, and to submit any amendment(s) to the Minister for review.

One of the purposes of a school board's Special Education Plan is to inform the Ministry of Education and the public about special education programs and services that are provided by the board in accordance with legislation and ministry policy on special education.







The Ministry of Education will review each school board's special education plan to inform the Ministry of Education and the public about special education programs and services that are provided by the board in accordance with legislation and ministry policy on special education.

The Ministry of Education reviews each school board's plan to determine whether it complies with the standards mentioned above. Compliance with the standards for School Boards' Special Education Plans (2000) includes Special Education Programs and Services, provincial information and other related information required for community which includes details regarding staff development.

The goal of the Special Education Staff Development Plan is to build capacity, skills and knowledge for Administrators, teachers (Classroom and Special Education teachers), Education Assistants and professionals to ensure that high quality programs and services are provided for our students whether it complies with the standards mentioned above. The aim of the review is to ensure that certain standards are maintained across the province in the development and provision of special education programs and services. Where the ministry determines that a board's plan does not comply with the standards, the ministry will require the board to amend its plan. Amending the plan will include responding to identified omissions. Boards will make the necessary changes and submit the amendments to the ministry the following year.

Re: Needs-based Funding/Services For Children with a Diagnosis Of Autism - New Pilot Program

We are writing on behalf of the Special Advisory Committee (SEAC) of the Durham District School Board (DDSB) to request clarification of and to share our concerns regarding the implementation of the new funding model to support children with a diagnosis of Autism.

It is our understanding the Ministry intends to implement a pilot program, in which 600 families will be assigned using a lottery system. It is also our understanding that, at this time, the pilot has not been implemented, leaving our families caught on an unmoving wait list until the pilot is assigned, implemented, evaluated and then a decision made about how to move forward with the service. Families have been communicating anxiety, worry and stress while waiting in limbo for services.

Concerns regarding the use of Family Support Workers as the individuals responsible for guiding families in the use of their funding, have been at the forefront for families. Specifically, what training will they have received? What experience and/or lived experience will be required for this role? How will the success of that guidance be assessed?

At a school board level, the lack of clarity surrounding the implementation of this pilot project, can have challenging impacts on service planning, class placements and staffing to ensure that the needs of these students are met at the school and class level.

Historically, there has always been a long wait for services dedicated to children with a diagnosis of Autism, despite the knowledge that these services have the greatest efficacy in the early years. While we

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understand that the Ministry will be implementing a pilot, the fact that this has not yet begun, has created additional back log in access to services and caused further stress on families already trying to navigate these unprecedented times.

We ask that the Ministry provide clarification as to when this pilot is expected to begin; the expected duration of this pilot; and when the Ministry expects to have a final decision on how it intends to move forward on service provision to children with a diagnosis of Autism.

Re: Support for Bill 172 An Act in Relation to Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)

The Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board (BHNCDSB) endorses Bill 172, the Education Statute Law Amendment Act regarding Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). The BHNCDSB in full support of a recommendation brought forward to the Board of Trustees by the Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) on May 25, 2021 to provide correspondence in support of the Bill.

Bill 172 will require all boards of education throughout Ontario to develop policies and guidelines with respect to FASD. Ontario Teacher College's and Early Childhood Education (ECE) programs shall be required to provide training with respect to suspected or diagnosed FASD.

There is a high prevalence of FASD among children in Ontario. This diagnosis impacts their ability to attend school due to a combination of deficits associated with the diagnosis, along with their capacity to understand the expectations and demands in an academic environment. Education staff need to be taught about the early signs and symptoms of FASD and how to provide appropriate accommodations in the classroom. Furthermore, the students will greatly benefit by promoting the awareness and understanding of FASD in teacher, early childhood educator and other educator programs, along with school boards developing policies and guidelines with respect to FASD.

The BHNCDSB asks that you acknowledge our support for Bill 172 as it will help our students experience success not only in their classrooms, but also within their communities.
